ABOUT THE MUSIC IN TODAY'S SERVICE

The Henry Purcell spent much of his very short life as organist of Westminster Abbey. He would write many pieces for solemn and grand ceremonies, including his Voluntary for 2 Trumpets. For many years he would be miscredited for writing 'Trumpet Voluntary,' a piece very often used at weddings, now credited to his contemporary, Jeremiah Clarke.

Sigfrid Karg-Elert was a German organist and composer who lived in the early part of the 20th Century. His mentor was the great Norwegian composer, Edvard Grieg. Even though his was appointed Professor of Composition at the Leipzig Conservatory, his Alma Mater, his skills as an organist were not as favorable as other notable organists of that time, particularly Marcel Dupre and Louis Vierne. He was a diabetic, which eventually took his life in 1933, at the age of 55. Today's march is based upon the hymn, 'Now Thank We All Our God," which is present throughout the piece but only clearly heard at major resting points.


